Our menu caters for a variety of diets and preferences. Our Underground Wine Cellar is stocked with a large selection of very good South African wines.








TREKKING

We are blessed with some of the most magnificent walking and hiking trails in the region. There are easy ones for young families as well as informative nature walks through dense fern forests, including one to a cave, which echoes and another to a cave where cannibals once lived.

A highlight is to spend a day walking along the Tugela River to the Tugela Gorge. There is an adventurous hike to the 3100m summit of the Drakensberg Amphitheatre where the views are spectacular. We provide experienced guides and healthy packed lunches for both outings.






FAMILY HOLIDAYS

There are canoe trips on the dam and there is an exciting and secure playground in the garden. THE GREAT OUTDOORS

The Cavern is midway between Joburg and Durban - a beautiful country drive. Our valley is rich and diverse, home to Bushman paintings, rock carvings and an interesting cannibal history - all in a natural setting where bird, animal, tree and flower species flourish. The Cavern is nationally recognised by KwaZulu-Natal Wildlife as a Site of Conservation Significance.







PRESERVE

We conserve the historical heritage of this landscape and protect the healing gifts these mountains offer. Through years of eradicating invader species, maintaining the natural surrounds and investing in solar energy, our property has remained pristine.

The grasslands are rich with *'berg* flowers, the forests are home to 70 tree species and our bird list has 204 species, 24 of which are endemic. Eland patrol the hills and feature in many ancient Bushman cave paintings. Baboons and mountain reedbuck can be seen on the slopes. You might even spot our resident leopard who prowl at night.





BUILDING COMMUNITY

For generations, we've been involved in establishing schools and crèches in the amaZizi Village. Cavern staff, from the local community, are trained, nurtured and empowered.

The Khanyisela Project supports 18 pre-schools and 750 children. We provide daily porridge for children, training for teachers, and educational resources and maintenance for schools. Royal Drakensberg Primary ensures a solid foundation for learning. Children *learn2read* so they can *read2learn*. BabyBoost focuses on the first 1000 days where we nourish development by empowering parents with childcare information and support.
